As the sole provider for her young son, and caregiver for her mother, Tori contacted McKee Wellness Foundation for emergency hardship relief in order to help pay her rent.

## Launching mental health funding

Thousands of friends, neighbors, coworkers, even family members, here in our community, live in pain. They may feel that nobody cares or understands them. They may feel too vulnerable to reach out for help. Or, they simply may not have the resources available to get well.

giving care to our caregivers experiencing supply chain and staff shortages




### OLDER ADULTS

# A VOICE FOR VETERANS

## Serving Northern Colorado's heroes

Mark\*, a Marine Corps veteran, was living with outdated hearing aids to assist with his service-connected hearing loss. While they provided some assistance, background noise distorted much of what he heard. Additionally, Mark's rechargeable hearing aid batteries were unable to hold a charge through the entire day, often causing Mark to pick and choose which part of the day he could hear. Living with a traumatic brain injury as well, Mark struggled to remember to charge his hearing aids consistently.

Through grant funding from McKee Wellness Foundation to our partners at Aspire3D, Mark was able to access hearing aids that provide significantly increased hearing quality and last 30 hours on a single charge. This allows him to hear the entire day.

During 2022, MWF donors assisted 51 veterans through Aspire3D/Loveland Housing Authority, ranging in age from 23 to 79. These heroes received assistance with transportation costs, medical co-pays, holistic care appointments, and other needs to help improve their quality of life and overall wellness.





# LOVELAND COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER

Quality healthcare for all

In 1997, the Loveland community stepped forward in support of a facility where medically underserved citizens could access quality medical, dental, and prescription support. The Loveland Community Health Center is still standing tall in support of the Loveland community today.

In May of 2022, Marjorie\* contacted McKee Wellness Foundation after having exhausted her savings battling both leukemia and lymphoma. Though cancer-free, her treatment caused substantial side-effects to her teeth, resulting in a serious dental infection and pneumonia that required immediate care. The Foundation was able to link Marjorie with Loveland Community Health Center to provide the critical medical care and dental procedures needed to put a smile back on her face. # WE DON'T MISS A BEAT

Protecting hearts in Northern Colorado

Damar Hamlin, safety for the Buffalo Bills, collapsed during a Monday night football game in early 2023. Immediately first responders began lifesaving interventions, CPR and Automated External Defibrillation (AED). While he remained in critical condition for several days, Damar Hamlin survived because of access to an AED and CPR.

In partnership with Thompson Valley Emergency Medical Services, McKee Wellness Foundation is dedicated to making sure Loveland is a HEARTSafe Community.

The program is dedicated to placing life-saving AEDs in local businesses and provides CPR certification. Access to an AED during a cardiac event dramatically increases the patient's chance of survival.
